Amyr Joyner has performed in numerous venues across the country and internationally as a fervent orchestral, chamber, and solo performer. His most recent concert engagements include performances at the Grant Park Music Festival's 2013 Advocate for the Arts Awards Benefit, and chamber music at both the Ray Charles Performing Arts Center at Morehouse in Atlanta, and Symphony Hall in Jacksonville as a member of the Ritz Chamber Players.

Joyner has been a member with the Verbier Festival Orchestra, Sphinx Chamber Orchestra, and the Soulful Symphony. He has performed and toured around the country with the Sphinx Virtuosi Orchestra and has performed in venues including Carnegie Hall, Millennium Park, and the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. He has been featured on Atlanta NPR radio and Detroit television news. He has participated in a number of summer festivals including the Verbier Music Festival in Switzerland, Grant Park Music Festival in Chicago, Colour of Music Festival, Gateways Music Festival, Aspen Music Festival, and Heifetz Music Festival. He has also served as a violin teaching artist for the Atlanta Music Project, an El-Sistema based program in Southwest Atlanta. He has performed solos for the Grammy in the Schools National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences Convention, and the National Association of Negro Musicians Convention.

Joyner is currently a violinist of the Symphony Orchestra of Augusta, and acts as a substitute violinist for the New World symphony.
